#### 201,248

Volunteering hours were recorded, more than double those for 22-23 demonstrating the continued dedication of network volunteers to contribute their time and energy to community action within Oxfordshire.



Events and activities were held across the county, reaching over 120,000 participants


These activities resulted in....

#### Abingdon Community Fridge

Fights food waste by redistributing surplus food from local businesses and members of the community.

#### Oxford Wood Recycling

OWR has two key aims:

 to relieve unemployment by providing jobs, work placements, training and volunteering opportunities for people whose circumstances, such as disability, mean that they are very often excluded from work and
 to protect the natural environment by recycling and re-using waste wood and promoting the use of sustainably-produced timber.

#### **Stonehill Community Gardens**

Stonehill Community Garden offers groups or individuals the opportunity to get involved and learn about growing food, healthy eating, foraging and nature identification and care. They aim to bring people closer to nature and to share the joys of being outside and gardening together.

#### **Sustainable Blewbury**

Exist to explore ways in which we as a village can adapt to a low carbon and more sustainable way of living, while maintaining a good quality of life. SB places the highest priority on raising awareness of climate change and communicating urgently how it affects all our lives.

#### Sustainable Harwell

A community action group operating in Harwell village, working on sustainability projects including reducing waste and pollution.

#### **Sustainable Shrivenham**

Works with the community to provide information, workshops and other resources to help people reduce their food waste, reduce their single use plastic consumption, reduce their meat consumption, improve recycling and repairing instead of landfill use.

#### **Sustainable Wantage**

Focused on activities that protect and enhance our natural environment and strengthen our local community. We are run by volunteers interested in actions that have a positive impact and increase our resourcefulness and resilience as a community.

#### <u>Westmill Sustainable Energy Trust - WeSET</u>

Set up by members of the Westmill Wind Farm Cooperative and the Westmill Solar Cooperative. We deliver a wide range of initiatives, with the core being educational work: supporting local energy conservation; renewable energy initiatives; arts projects; and facilitating visits to the Westmill Wind Farm and Solar Park.
